The Pastor's Pen "It's About Discipleship"

Billy Graham has just died. This greatest of 20th Century evangelists preached to hundreds of millions of people and brought countless souls to Christ through his simple message of the gospel. I am one of



them. I remember going forward at the end of a movie crusade his organization organized to give my life to Jesus Christ. I was in 3rd Grade. Ms. Snyder, my elementary school teacher, was a counselor at the altar rail at the end of the movie. Later, she gave me a small devotional book which encouraged me to start reading the Bible every day. I did just that.

Looking back, I realize that was an important piece of Christian discipleship. Disciples study Jesus' word This command is at the heart of the Great Commission, which Jesus gave to all his disciples just before ascending to heaven:

"All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Mathew 28:18-20 NIV

Disciples are not just supposed to study Jesus' word. Disciples put them into practice. Learning to do everything Jesus commanded is far more than head knowledge. It is like learning carpentry. You may study all the books you like about carpentry; you may buy lots of tools and have a lovely shop. Yet you will never be a carpenter if you do not pick up the tools and put your learning into practice. As his disciples, we are to put all our Lord's teachings into practice. James, the brother of the Lord, puts it like this: "Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." (James 1:22). I like how one church summarized discipleship: Love God, love each other, serve others. Disciples don't just do those things. They do them together as a body. They grow together, and as they grow in spiritual maturity together by putting Christ's teaching into practice, they attract new disciples who want the same life evident in them.

Lately, I've been thinking a lot about discipleship in our church. Our mission as a church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We adopted that formally as our mission statement about ten years ago. In thinking and praying about how we can be more effective in making disciples, I'm asking myself: What is our intentional plan and process for making

disciples? Do we have one? Is every member aware of it? Is every member involved in it? How are we systematically training all our members, from the youngest to the oldest, to consistently, daily, and diligently love God, love each other, and serve others? What are we doing to accomplish our mission?

The mission is everything the church is supposed to be about. Remember Mission Impossible? The whole point of every show was to accomplish the mission. If the mission failed, the show would have been a bust. No one would tune in again. So also with the church. Any church that consistently fails at making disciples is going to go bust! What does it take to be an effective disciple-making church?

This is the theme of a book I've been reading titled, Simple Church: Returning to God's Process for Making Disciples, by Thom S. Rainer and Eric Geiger. The purpose of the Church is to make disciples. The authors have done extensive research about the disciple-making process of many churches. Those that are doing discipleship effectively have an intentional process, focus all their energy on it, and let go of things that don't accomplish the mission. They simplify to focus on what is most important. Then they have the energy, time and resources to accomplish the goal.

I read of a similar theme in a recent Wall Street Journal article titled: "How to Succeed in Business? Do less" (WSJ January 12, 2018.). The point of the article is captured in its opening sentence: "Most top performers in business have one thing in common: They accept fewer tasks and then obsess about getting them right!" The Simple Church authors discovered the same point in churches. Effective disciple-making churches accept the mission of making disciples as their most important task. They turn down other tasks and obsess about getting that main one right.

So, where are you at in all this? Are you growing as a disciple? Do you know you should be, wish you could be, but don't know how to get there? In the coming months, the leadership of the church will be focusing on this need. We created the recent survey to assess how effective we are in our ministry and mission and begin preparing for what's next. The Lord wants us to be an effective disciple-making church. That is our mission! We didn't make it up. He gave it to us. He wants every one of us to grow as his disciple, and he has the resources to help make that happen. You'll hear more in the coming months. Please pray that we may all put into practice what the Lord teaches us and follow where he leads!

Supporting Families Through Opioid Addiction

Most of you have heard about the opioid crisis that we currently have in our country. I am sure you know someone personally or have heard about a family that is going through the trials of this drug addiction. Members of our own church and community are suffering through this problem with their addicted brothers, sisters, children, parents and friends.

Opioids, prescription and illicit, are the main driver of drug overdose deaths. Opioids were involved in 42,249 US deaths in 2016, and opioid overdose deaths were five times higher in 2016 than 1999.

According to the CDC, in 2016, the five states with the highest rates of death due to drug overdose were West Virginia (52.0 per 100,000), Ohio (39.1 per 100,000), New Hampshire (39.0 per 100,000), Pennsylvania (37.9 per 100,000) and (Kentucky (33.5 per 100,000).

This crisis is real. Families are affected everyday by this growing concern. An addiction destroys families as much as it destroys individuals. Living with an addict is both heartbreaking and exhausting. Family members are torn between how to help the addict and how to avoid being sucked into the addict's world.

Things You Can do for Yourself

- Take care of yourself. Living with an addict is exhausting. You also need time to recover.
- Avoid self-blame. You can't control another person's decisions, and you can't force them to change.
- Do not work harder than the person you're trying to help. The best approach is to not do things for the addict, but instead to be an example of balance and self-care.
- Being a caretaker is not good for you or the addict. Understand that there is only so much you can do to change another person.
- Ask for help. Talk to a professional. Go to a support group such as Al-Anon. (More support groups are listed below.)
- Do not argue or try to discuss things with the addict when they are under the influence. It won't get you anywhere.
- If at all possible, try not to be negative when dealing with the addict.
 That may only increase their feelings of guilt and push them further into using. (Reference: www.AddictionsAndRecovery.org)

Health and Welfare and Stephen Ministry are working together to bring an educational program to First Church about the Opioid Epidemic and how we, as a congregation, can support those dealing with individuals with this problem. We are looking to open this up to the congregation and the community sometime in spring. Please look for more information in the near future about this program and consider participating in it.




